Lotus Light Serves Hope in the Face of Poverty

Lotus Light's food recovery program volunteers helped deliver **7,000 lbs** of fresh yoghurt, cheese, pasta, baked goods and other grocery items to serve low-income families, inner city students and the homeless in Metro Vancouver over the past 2 weeks.

"This is not all about just providing food – we do this to shine a light of hope and caring. Metro Vancouver is seeing more individuals and families struggling to feed and house themselves on marginal incomes and finding even jam and peanut butter to be expensive," said Master Lian Tzi, President of Lotus Light Charity Society.

Nearly 2,000 lbs representing nearly 5,000 servings of fresh assorted yoghurt with toppings were delivered to **Belkin House (Salvation Army)** in downtown Vancouver. Belkin is the largest supportive housing project in BC for the homeless, and those at risk of homelessness and low-income families. The shelter facility serves 3 meals per day.

The other 2,000 lbs of yoghurt was well received by 844 low-income families in **Richmond**, where 1 in 4 children in the community live in poverty according to the *BC Child Poverty Report Card*.

Over 500 students received blueberry yoghurt at **Thunderbird Elementary**, a Tier 1 inner city eastside school in Vancouver. The school is located across the street from the largest social housing project in BC, where many of the students live. A lot of students are from working poor families, single parent households, immigrant and refugee families. Some students arrive at school disadvantaged because of poverty.

Nearly 300 students participating in **Strathcona Community Centre's Backpack Program** also enjoyed the blueberry yoghurt. The backpack program provides snacks and meals to fill the hunger gap of the weekend when children are not supported by the school's food programs they depend on during the week.



Over 2,600 lbs of pasta, baked goods and grocery items were also distributed amongst various charities benefiting low-income families in Richmond, Burnaby, and the vulnerable community members of Downtown Eastside.

Thanks to the generosity of Lotus Light's donors, this large food donation of over \$66,000 was made possible to benefit a large spectrum of our Metro Vancouver community.

Every July, *Lotus Light Community Caring Day* is a free community festival event held at Oppenheimer Park to bring together individuals, businesses, neighborhood groups and vital community service volunteer groups to raise awareness, provide resources and support to the poorest members of our local Downtown Eastside community (low-income families, men, women, children, seniors and homeless).
